Al-Busaiteen Intermediate Girls School Al-Busaiteen - Muharraq Governorate Kingdom of Bahrain

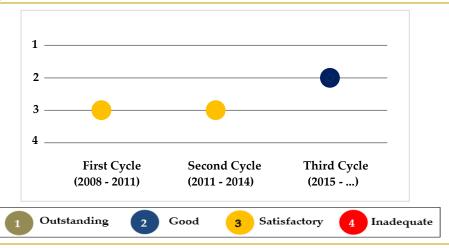

### Introduction

The Directorate of Government Schools Reviews (DGS), which is a part of the National Authority for Qualifications and Quality Assurance of Education and Training (QQA), conducted this review over three days by a team of six reviewers. During the review, reviewers observed lessons and other activities, scrutinised students' written work and analysed the school's performance data and other documents. They met with staff, students and parents. This report summarises their findings and recommendations.

# Judgement justifications

- Since the last review the school's performance has improved from satisfactory to good in the aspects of academic achievement and teaching and learning, and from good and satisfactory to outstanding in the rest of the aspects.
- Accurate and comprehensive selfevaluation leads to the development of effective strategic and operational plans. Monitoring and development of the plans is constant and in accordance with the improvement priorities.
- Efficient teaching and learning strategies are employed in the good and outstanding lessons, which

- account for about two thirds of all lessons. Mathematics, science and Arabic lessons are particular examples. The employment of these strategies appears to be appropriate in satisfactory lessons, English being a specific example, as a result of disparity in:
- benefiting from the results of assessment for learning, especially concerning low achieving students
- students' acquisition of basic English skills
- considering differentiation in activities and written works.

- The good standards of most students are in line with the high pass and proficiency rates in the majority of lessons.
- Students' participate with great enthusiasm and motivation in school life. They have high self-confidence and ability to assume leadership roles and responsibilities. Furthermore, they work together in harmony, demonstrating good behaviour and being committed to Islamic values,
- which shows in their great respect for teachers and peers.
- The counselling and guidance programmes are effective, greatly strengthening students' sense of security. Both students and parents are satisfied with the school's provision.
- The various extra-curricular activities help in boosting students' experiences, developing their interests and significantly developing their personalities.

### Main positive features

- The leadership is deeply aware of the school's situation, which shows in their accurate and comprehensive self-evaluation results, which are used in identifying development priorities and continuously planning for improvements in school performance.
- Students enthusiastically participate in school life, have significant confidence and ability to assume leadership roles and responsibilities, behave well and work in harmony together.
- The advice and guidance programmes are outstanding, as is the diversity of extracurricular activities that enhance both the school curriculum and students' experiences, contributing to students' personal development.
- The professional development programmes are effective, contributing to the improvement of most teachers' performance, thereby the progress of students in lessons and written works.

### Recommendations

- Continue implementing and applying the outstanding practices and leading-edge projects in all aspects of schoolwork.
- Spread the excellent and good educational practices to build the students' achievements towards academic excellence, and develop teaching and learning processes to further focus on:
  - providing students with the basic skills in English

- utilising assessment results to meet the educational needs of the different categories of students, especially low achievers
- considering differentiation in activities and written works.
- Fill the shortage in human resources represented by senior teachers for all academic departments, and a nurse.

### Judgement justifications

- The school leadership is deeply aware of its situation. There are extensive quality procedures and a culture of change, with well organised administrative operations. The leadership learns from exceptional practices in learning communities and keeps abreast of the latest educational developments in order to improve the school's overall performance from 'Satisfactory' to 'Good'.
- The school's leadership shows great ability making exceptional in improvements in the aspects of personal development and support and guidance, where it has focused on diversity of extra-curricular activities and educational programmes which has contributed to students' personal development and fulfillment of their different educational needs according to their categories.
- The self-evaluation's accuracy and comprehensiveness of school procedures have helped in developing the strategic plan, which includes clear accurate performance indicators. The

- plan focuses on improvement and development priorities and is implemented and monitored in accordance with efficient procedures.
- The school's judgments in the selfevaluation form match the judgments reached by the review team in most of the review aspects.
- The effectiveness of professional development programmes shows in improving the performance of most teachers and the progress of students in lessons and written works.
- The school leadership shows high capability in facing challenges. For instance, overcoming the shortage of senior teachers in all departments, by preparing and training a competent second middle leadership line, which became highly effective in spreading educational practices. Another example is the organisation of a secure arrival and departure mechanism to manage the traffic jam at the school's thereby ensuring students' gates, safety.
