

Introduction

The Directorate of Government Schools Reviews (DGS), which is a part of the National Authority for Qualifications and Quality Assurance of Education and Training (QQA), conducted this review over three days by a team of seven reviewers. During the review, reviewers observed lessons and other activities, scrutinised students' written works and analysed the school's performance data and other documents. They spoke to the staff, students and parents. This report summarises their findings and recommendations.

Judgement justifications

- The school remains satisfactory in the students' aspects of academic achievement, teaching and learning and leadership, management governance, and achieved good students' personal progress in development and support guidance.
- Students perform well in internal and external examinations in most core subjects, which reflect their actual levels in most class-teaching, standards and science lessons in Cycle 2.
- Clear self-evaluation mechanisms, with variable use of the results to

- prioritise areas of improvement and development, to be embedded when setting specific targets in departments' plans.
- The majority of teachers manage lessons in an orderly and productive manner and use varied teaching and learning strategies. However, the effectiveness of assessment techniques for learning, differentiation and the support provided for the different categories of students, especially the low achievers, varies.
- The students' good behaviour, their effective communication with each other and their positive participation

in school life, is supported by diverse guidance programmes and extracurricular activities which help develop the experiences and different interests of most students. Diverse partnerships with parents and the community enrich and enhance students' experiences. Students and parents are satisfied with the school's provision.

Main positive features

- The students' standards in core subjects, particularly in Cycle 1, and in science in Cycle 2.
- Students' good behaviour, harmony when they work together, and their active participation in school life.
- Support and guidance programmes as well as the extra-curricular activities which develop students' experiences and interests.

Recommendations

- Better use of self-evaluation results to prioritise school work and develop action planning in academic departments.
- Develop the students' basic skills in English in both cycles, as well as in Arabic and mathematics in Cycle 2.
- Monitor the impact of professional development programmes in order to benefit from the good teaching practices in school and implement effective teaching and learning strategies, with a focus on:
 - assessment for learning
 - educational support for low achieving students
 - considering differentiation and challenging students' abilities in activities and homework assignments.
- Address the shortage in human resources, namely senior teachers for class teaching, science, Arabic and English.

Judgement justifications

- Strategic planning is adequate and based on rigorous and comprehensive self-evaluation, however with inconsistent focus on improvement
- and development priorities across school departments.
- The school's capacity to address challenges is adequate, with a

- shortage in middle leadership in the main departments, variable implication of the school's vision across departments, and the building's limited capacity in light of growing number of students.
- Implementation of action plans is inconsistent, particularly those related to professional development and training plans, and monitoring of their
- impact on teaching practices in lessons.
- The school takes good care of students, supports them when they face problems, and effectively builds up their personal and leadership skills through extra-curricular activities and events which develop their experiences and interests.
