Do you know how to start a recycling business that benefits the environment? Your new project can also make you a lot of money. **(0)** ___ **G** ____. You can turn almost any waste material into products suitable for a variety of customers to buy.

The first thing is to identify recyclable waste materials and creatively transform them into useful products. **(21)** _____. For example, you can collect plastic bottles and turn them into flowerpots or bird feeders. You'll discover how paper, cans, cardboard and glass make delightful decorations and accessories.

Waste materials may be collected from homes, schools, and communities, or bought from other people. This is easier than you might think. Air Conditioning

Before air conditioning was invented, ice and snow were used for cooling in countries where snow fell. The ancient Egyptians had their own form of air conditioning using natural long grasses and water. The Romans used water pipes inside walls to keep rooms cool. In the seventeenth century Europeans began harvesting ice and keeping it frozen underground for use in the summer. This process was replaced with mechanical ice machines by Americans in the nineteenth century. Finally, in 1902, Willis Carrier, a 25-year-old engineer from the US, invented the first air-conditioning unit.

When Carrier started working at a paper printing company in Brooklyn in New York, he noticed that the changes in dampness in the air were causing the size of the printing paper to be irregular. Carrier decided to invent a machine that could control the dampness and heat levels in the printing area. Consequently, the quality of the paper would improve. His invention lowered the dampness, which made it very useful for industries such as film, processed food and textiles.

Before the 1920s it was rare to see air conditioning units in private houses because of their huge size, which was similar to the size of early computers. This made them unsuitable for domestic use. Later, in the 1930s smaller models were introduced but were too costly for the general public. Then, in the 1940s, smaller, cheaper units were sold but people found the accompanying instructions too technical. Finally, during the 1950s smaller, cheaper cooling units with easier instructions were available.

Cooling for human comfort, rather than for industrial need became even more popular when three air conditioners were installed in a department store in Detroit, Michigan. People crowded into the store to experience the new invention. The popularity of air conditioning spread to cinemas, where the financial benefits rose remarkably as a result of the comfort offered. Hotels began to offer air-conditioned rooms as guests would consider this when booking. Larger restaurants also began to advertise their

air-conditioned rooms which customers could dine in with their families during the summer.

Owners of small businesses hesitated to invest in air conditioning as they regarded it to be a luxury that would make employees too comfortable and less efficient. In order to convince employers that this belief is incorrect, the air conditioning industry conducted its own study which concluded that installing air conditioning actually increased workers' efficiency. Other research into increased productivity in offices also proved that air conditioning was the single most important factor. As a result, the air conditioning industry changed its marketing strategy.

However, air conditioning does have its disadvantages in terms of energy use and its role in contributing to air pollution. It is general knowledge that air conditioning is a major factor in global warming. Although air conditioning leads to higher temperatures, people have to use it even more than before, especially in hot countries where it is essential.
